In the state of Uttar Pradesh, India, Mathura and Vrindavan are considered sacred places of Hinduism as these places are believed to be the birthplace of Lord Shri Krishna. The **"Chaar Dham,"** built here in Vrindavan is an otherworldly pilgrimage site or a shrine that holds great significance for the followers of Indian Sanatana Dharma (Hinduism). It exemplifies the divine devotion and spiritual essence of Indian culture. Dr. J.C. Chaudhry laid the foundation stone of Maa **Vaishno Devi Dham** on November 27, 2004, which was completed in just five years, five months, and twenty-five days.

On May 22, 2010, this vast complex was opened to devotees for darshan (worship), and the foundation stone for the Chaar Dham was laid on August 23, 2021. The Chaar Dham was completed on November 24, 2023, within a span of only two years, three months, and one day. This massive complex, spread over approximately 11 acres of land, is dedicated to the worship of **Shiv Dham**, **Radha Krishna Dham** and **Shani Dham**.

The services to be dedicated/offered.

- In front of the temple, there is a Maa Vaishno Devi Jagran / Chowki (A spiritual gathering).
- Spiritual lectures in the room.
- Decoration of the temple during Navratri and other festivals (Inside).
- Offering daily bhog (food offering) to Maa Vaishno Devi during Navratri.
- Maintenance of guest accommodations every month.
- Performing havan (ritual fire) and yagna (sacrificial offering) daily.
- Decorating the temple.
- Maa Vaishno Devi's attire (clothing).
- Cleaning and maintenance inside the temple every month.
- Providing bags for shoes at the service area every month.

The place provides facilities for conducting night vigils, watch, and spiritual discourses in the four pilgrimage sites.

Guesthouse (Including fee)

Smt. Bhagwani Devi Guesthouse

This is a guesthouse with 46 rooms, of which 26 rooms are on the ground floor and 20 rooms are on the first floor. It is built to accommodate pilgrims. The ground floor rooms measure 14.9 feet by 10.7 feet, while the first-floor rooms measure 14.3 feet by 10.7 feet.



Shri Tola Ram Chaudhry Guesthouse

This is the second guesthouse within the temple complex, which has 22 rooms specifically built for pilgrims. It also provides bedding arrangements for the convenience of the devotees.

Guesthouse Rules & Regulations

- Smoking and tobacco, gutka, etc., are strictly prohibited.
- 2. Bringing and consuming alcohol, beer, and any type of alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
- 3. Bringing weapons/firecrackers is prohibited.
- 4 Please turn off lights, fans, AC, and LCD when not in use.
- 5. There is no room service available in the rooms.
- 6. One guest can be given a room for a maximum of 6 days.
- 7. Check-in is at 12:00 PM and check-out is at 11:00 AM.
- Showing Identification proof is mandatory at the time of entry. Acceptable forms of identification are Aadhar Card, PAN Card, Passport, Voter ID, and Driving License. A copy of the identification must be submitted at the office for record-keeping.
- In case of losing the room key, an additional charge of ₹400 will be levied for changing the lock.
- 10. Food is available in the dining hall at the rate of ₹100/per meal only. Meal timings are as follows:
 - (a) Breakfast: 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM (Please notify by 7:00 AM)
 - (b) Lunch: 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM (Please notify by 11:00 AM)
 - (c) Dinner: 8:00 PM to 10:30 PM (Please notify by 6:00 PM)
- Please take care of your valuable belongings, cash, etc. The management committee will not be responsible for any loss or damages.
- 12. Vehicle parking is to be done in the parking area near the entry gate number 2 of the temple premises. Park vehicles at your own risk.
- Do not litter in the temple premises; use dustbins for disposing of garbage.
- 14 Dry clothes on the designated area on the first-floor balcony i.e, on wires. It is not allowed to dry clothes in balcony or in the room.
- 15. Kindly make a voluntary donation from the heart for the expenses of the temple and ensure to take the donation receipt.
- 16. In case of any emergency, please contact 91-9997000603/604.
- 17. If any guest causes any damage, he/she will have to compensate for it.
- If any person violates the rules, he/she will be required to leave the temple premises immediately without any compensation.
- 19 Every person should respect the sanctity of the temple and follow the ethical standards and rules for the courteous environment of the temple.
